Launching and recovery

The club slipway is long, steep, and can be very slippery. Some members find it difficult to launch and recover their boats under these conditions. If you offer to help to launch or recover, it will be very much appreciated, and can make a huge difference to the enjoyment of our less physically able members, especially those sailing singlehanded boats.

So please don't leave anyone struggling on the slipway while you go for a coffee.

Duties

As a small-scale volunteer led club, the committee depends on input from members to make the club work effectively. We ask that members contribute by undertaking Race Officer duties on race days and "Meet and Greet" duties on Open sailing days. You will be asked to sign up for at least 2 duties per year using our Dutyman system and more information about what is expected of you can be found on our Members page.

Working Parties

We also run occasional working parties to keep the site in a good condition. We ask that members attend at least one work party per year, eg. to tidy the dinghy park or clean the slipway. This helps keep subscriptions down but is also an enjoyable part of club life. Notice of working parties will be emailed to the membership in good time.
